## **FOUNDATION TIMELINE**

1983

Chamber partnered with local law enforcement agencies to present the Clermont County Law Enforcement Appreciation Banquet during National Police Week

1988

Leadership Clermont County is developed. Name evolved to LEAD Clermont Institute, LEAD Clermont Academy (2012), and LEAD Clermont Community Leadership Program (2019). LEAD Clermont alumni consists of 1 031 leaders.

1989

UC Clermont College Scholarship Fund\* was created by the Chamber. Recipients for the 24/25 scholarships are Maria Pauley and August Cloud, each awarded \$1,000.

1990s

Chamber holds first golf outing. Gather on the Green. Event name later changed to Golf for Kids to benefit the Work Readiness Initiative

1994

Salute to Leaders Awards is created to honor Clermont County volunteers. Biennial event after 2023.

2011

Clermont Chamber of Commerce Foundation is established as a 501(c)(3) charitable entity. 10th anniversary celebrated in 2021.

2012

Work Readiness Initiative is created to partner with schools and businesses to prepare students to be "work ready."

2013

Chamber established the University of Cincinnati Clermont Law Enforcement Scholarship Fund\*. A \$50,000 endowment was fully funded in 2022. Recipient for the 24/25 scholarship is Nathan Hermes, awarded \$1.500.

2016

KLiCWOW is born. Program provides free tablets and WOW pouches to children aged three and four in Clermont. 1,690 tablets distributed to date. The program was discontinued in 2025.

2023

Chamber Foundation Endowment is created. Its total funding to date stands at \$17,020.
